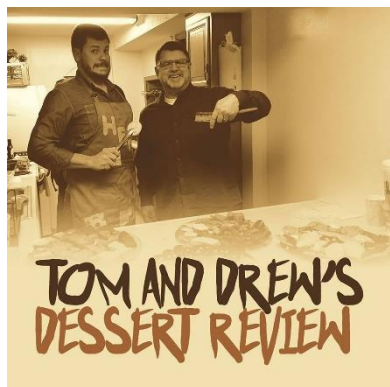

“I have discovered after teaching for a number of years that part of the problem of people not knowing how to interpret the New Testament (NT) occurs because they don’t know the Old Testament (OT). Most of the NT derives its definitions, teaching, promises and ideas from OT doctrine. Reading the NT without knowing and studying the OT is like walking into the middle of a movie and trying to guess the plot and where it is going. Some movies are easier than others to figure out if one walks in at the halfway point, but others that have a complex plot, lots of dialogue, and many twists will be extremely hard to figure out. Hence, the Bible is that movie.”
