Reminiscing with Martensdale

On a hill off of Highway 92, sits a small white building with a rich history of its very own. Built for the working farmers of the rolling fields that lie before it, the church set its course for the strong men and women who praised God there in truth.

On November 23, 1947, this unique group of believers first met in a home at Winterset, Iowa. They came from the three Churches of Christ in Des Moines, Iowa, to be closer to the work on their farms. The Dean Avenue Church of Christ assisted this small group in their transition.

Sunday morning services began at 10:30 a.m. so that the milking of cows could be done and again at 8:00 p.m. for the same reason. This is only one evidence of its uniqueness.

They purchased six new Bibles and thirty new song books for the edification of the church.

On January 15, 1948, they changed the location of the church to Bevington, Iowa, and two more Christians were added to the group there. On Feb. 29, 1948, the group moved, for the good of the work, to a school house they rented. They held several weekly meetings, with the aid of a visiting evangelist. A tent meeting was held on the Wicks picnic grounds, but the church was searching for a permanent place to build their building.

AN ACRE TO BUILD

In 1949, Burt Fritz (grandfather to the Bown brothers Al, Arlis, Fred, and Richard, three of which continue to worship there to this day) donated an acre of pasture land to secure a location to begin building.

With the help of neighbors, Christians, and carpenters the basement was dug and made suitable for worship and Bible classes by **December 19, 1950**. During this fruitful time, much work was done to teach the lost in their area. The church held gospel meetings and souls were added to their number as they had baptisms from their work.

SPECIAL VISITOR

This effort included the help of Roy Harris, evangelist, school teacher, music instructor and gospel hymn writer. Roy wrote many familiar hymns in our song books such as Hilltops of Glory, In the Shadow of His Wings, Thoughts of Home, and many others. Roy visited Martensdale in the summers of **1949 through 1951** and gave the Bown brothers a formal and thorough instruction in music and leading songs. Though Fred Bown was only 9 years old at the time, he remembers very well the lessons he received from Roy. Al Bown traveled with Roy on his evangelizing trips, resulting in another strong song leader at Martensdale.

In the spring of 1953, the congregation finished the upstairs. Christians came from Kansas City, Missouri, to help guide the new Church of Christ. The church continued under their supervision until they had two elders and two deacons appointed **on Jan 7, 1967**.



The source of this information is from a letter written by the Bown brothers' mother, Berniece. She ended it with the following: "There is a cordial welcome out to all people at all times."

- **Our hearts were saddened when the last Suddeth sibling was called home**, but we are rejoicing in her life well lived and her devotion to Christ.
