“Is there just one way to the Pearly Gate?”

In regards to salvation, a question often asked is, “*Is it true there is only one Church?*” Most Christians in the Lord’s church would say, “*Yes!*” without hesitation. But Pope Benedict XVI also says the same, as do all the Popes before him and after him.

Pope Benedict again stated this publicly declaring all denominations as “*not true churches*”. The man is not blindly dogmatic, but states the Truth. However, he encases that Truth with a falsehood when he declares that the Catholic institution is that “*single Church of Christ*”.

For one to discover the “*one true Church of Christ*”, we have no other reliable option but the Bible. There is not a more reliable authority than the Scriptures, else we end up on the endless road of catechisms, councils, and commentaries, none of them Divinely inspired.

Twelve Apostles but One Truth

In 1 Corinthians 1:13 the question is asked, “*Is Christ divided?*” The answer is—No. Jesus Christ commanded unity amongst His believers.

And Jesus knew their thoughts, and said unto them, “Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand.

~ Matthew 12:25

He that is not with me is against me: and he that gathereth not with me scattereth.

~ Luke 11:23

This presents quite a sad paradox. The Bible certainly preaches unity, yet our communities are populated with denominations that are utterly divided from each other. “*Agreed to disagree*” is a common way to put it.

But if just one of the denominations were to dare declare itself as the “*one true Church of Christ*”, then in the same breath, they would declare those they once called brethren, as heretics.

How can one explain and justify the existence of all the denominations purported to be Christian

churches? How can we intelligently and scripturally accept the different names, the contradicting doctrines, the multitude of catechisms and books that go along with the whole denominational package?

Howbeit in vain do they worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men.

~ Matthew 15:9 / Mark 7:7

“*We’re all on different paths heading towards the same place*” is another common explanation. But the whole essence of what we see in the New Testament casts a huge question mark on that statement, if not outright condemnation. Scripture and even pure reason make it evident that Jesus did not give His twelve Apostles twelve different religions, twelve different doctrines, twelve different paths to salvation. He gave them THE (one and only) path to salvation.

As Christ said,

“Broad is the way and wide is the gate that leadeth unto destruction and many there be which go in thereat.

Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way that leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it.”

~ Matthew 7:13-14

Know our Father in Heaven

Let’s pause here. And let’s dismiss the austerity and exclusiveness that “*one true church*” seems to portray to some. Is God not “*a God full of compassion, and gracious, long suffering, and plenteous in mercy and truth.*” ?

And concerning sinners, did not this same God say, “*I will be merciful to their unrighteousness, and their sins and their iniquities will I remember no more.*”

~ Hebrews 8:12

The writer of Hebrews was quoting Jeremiah 31, when God was telling Israel of the “*New Covenant*” that was to come through Jesus Christ.

This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, saith the Lord, I will put my laws into their hearts,

and in their minds will I write them. And their sins and iniquities will I remember no more.

~ Hebrews 8:16-17

Jesus portrayed a mirror image of the Father. His actions are the actions of God. And when the Apostles James and John wanted to “*call fire down from heaven*” upon a town that did not want to hear Jesus, His response was the same response they would have heard from God Himself:

But Jesus turned, and rebuked them, and said, “Ye know not what manner of spirit ye are of. For the Son of man is not come to destroy men’s lives, but to save them”. And they went to another village.

~ Luke 9:55-56

And with our Father, every day is a new beginning—regardless of our failures the day before or even the years before. With God, I can always have a clean start.

This I recall to my mind, therefore have I hope. It is of the Lord’s mercies that we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is Thy faithfulness.

~ Lamentations 3:21-23

Noah and the “one true Church”

The Church can be understood as the New Testament equivalent to Noah’s Ark in many ways:

- All mankind is invited—but very few accept the invitation.
~ 2 Peter 2:5 / John 3:19
- Noah and his family were “saved by water”— Today “baptism doth also now save us”.
~ 1 Peter 3:20-21
- They went in the Ark and God shut them in. Today, the Lord adds to the Church “such as should be saved.”
~ Gen 7:16 / Acts 2:47
- As God’s word came to Noah as the only Authority and Guide to save mankind, so is the Bible in our day. There was only one Ark to save mankind, and today there is only one Church for the same purpose.
- . . . *once the longsuffering of God waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was a preparing, wherein few, that is, eight souls were saved by water. The like figure whereunto even baptism doth also now save us*
~ 1 Peter 3:20-21

Whether with the Ark of Noah or the Church of Christ we see in both cases that unless you’re in it—your eternity is dark.

Attempting to find God and salvation outside of the Scriptures is like one in Noah’s day trying to survive the Flood outside the Ark. It is vain to seek the Lord outside of the Scriptures.

One Body, One Church

See below how the Scriptures define the Church as the ‘*Body of Christ*’. Not a foreign statement to the ears of anyone who has heard of Christianity.

And [God] hath put all things under [Christ’s] feet, and gave him to be the head over all things to the Church, which is his Body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all.

Ephesians 1:22-23

And he is the head of the body, the church: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things he might have the preeminence.

Colossians 1:18

Who now rejoice in my sufferings for you, and fill up that which is behind of the afflictions of Christ in my flesh for his body’s sake, which is the church:

Colossians 1:24

And then see how the Apostle states plainly . . .

There is ONE body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all.

Ephesians 4:4-6
