I do believe this is something we, as Christians, should take very seriously, especially as it seems to be primarily a danger to those who are older as well as those with compromised immune systems. I completely understand the serious precautions we are urged to take.

With this said, it is sad seeing our society as well as much of the world falling apart but not surprising. When your hope is in this world and the things of the world why would you not?

I certainly can understand why many people seem to be panicking to the point of fighting over and even hoarding consumer goods. I am reminded of Proverbs 28:1-- The wicked flee when no one pursues, But the righteous are bold as a lion. When all you have to hope for is this world, you are frightened of shadows. You are frightened of anything that threatens to take your hope away.

The Lord looked down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that did understand, and seek God. The apostle Paul spoke to this in 2 Timothy 1:7-- For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind. Jesus taught us to fear God and not the things that endanger our earthly existence.

Now I certainly do not wish to be misunderstood. I believe we should take this illness seriously, but let us not panic as many in the world are doing. Let us keep our heads and actions under control and our spirits fixed on Jesus and what Peace and Courage only He provides.

Let us continue to keep our eyes on the Prize and not be afraid as taught in Phil 3:14.

Our Hope is in the Lord and His crucifixion and subsequent resurrection. He will deliver us from this body of death if we continue to look unto Him as the author and finisher of our faith. THAT is worthy of our great and uncompromised attention. Not the distractions of this world. It is in Christ where our Hope is!

Early Christian History

A little known fact: The title "Apostolic Father" suggested, and was intended to suggest, the writings of those who had known the Apostles and were faithful to their teachings, as opposed to the writings of the New Testament, the work of the Apostles themselves. Modern scholarship would accept such a claim only in the cases of these three bishops, appointed by one of the Apostles: **Clement of Rome, Ignatius of Antioch, and Polycarp of Smyrna**—Polycarp being the most well documented. This fact, and especially scripture, debunks the lists of 'Apostolic Succession' claimed by Catholicism and several denominations.
