Oh, the things that money can't buy!

"I wish I could have lived when you did, so I could be happy." It was a relaxing time and I was presenting a slide show to a class of fifth graders, explaining about how we persevered during the Great Depression of the '30's. What a joy it was defining that happiness in those days while our adult population was dealing with shortage of jobs, money and food. Children lived in their own little world.

Next, it was time to gather props used to tell my story. Pretend "stick cars" could be gathered by any child, I had explained. We imagined our cars were blue, red, white, black or green; carrying symbols of a Ford, Chevy or whatever we desired. A young student was lingering near my project table with questions and comments. That is when he said, "I wish I could have lived when you did so I could be happy."

What these children had been taught from the few paragraphs in their textbooks could have desensitized and frightened them as they studied about the cold harsh facts of the Depression. Yes there were a few jobs, not much money and a scarcity of food, but still, kids were kids. At this time in our lives, we had to improvise--thinking of ways to play under a different set of circumstances. Our parents tried to not involve small children with adult worries, but let us live in our "let's pretend" world.

Stick cars were substituted for mechanical toys. The cars Sis and I chose were about three feet

long but needed to have bumps on the left side so the driver could start the engine (brr) or honk the horn (oogha). For a few minutes each day, we ran behind the stick in our game of "let's pretend."

We lived and played with what we had. Some of these "let's pretend" toys we made were--

--A doll house was made from cardboard boxes, furniture with discarded items for furniture.

--A moving picture show consisted of magazine pictures pasted on the back of a roll of wallpaper. The staircase was our theater. At the foot of the stairs was a box holding our reel, the roll of wallpaper.

--We crowned a Hollyhock Queen, adorned in our sister's blue prom dress. Her tiara was made from a circle of cardboard. Attendants wore dresses from Mom's big black trunk.

--Our playhouse was under the big mulberry tree, outlined in the dirt. We filled jar lids with mud and baked our mud pies in the sun. In our minds' eye, we were living like kings!

As a new Christian I learned to think upon the scripture 1 Cor. 13:11--"When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child. But when I became a man, I put away childish things."

After baptism, I learned how to trust and obey my heavenly parent. This time the principles given were for real life. I didn't pretend, I knew the facts! "God is

not slack concerning His promises but is long-suffering to usward, not willing that any should perish." We often have more zeal than knowledge. We ask the Lord to not remember the sins of our youth but to remember our obedience. We pray for wisdom, for a Christian mate, and for children. That prayer is answered, not always through us, but for us. We pray that, as parents, we might be understanding, strong and courageous in good times, as well as in tough times.

Money can't buy--a good name. The Bible says it is better than riches.

--a child's love

--trust

--a spot in heaven for eternity. We could own the whole world, but what is it worth if we lose our soul?

As children, we learned early there were things that money could not buy, such as happiness and joy.

I'm glad that I lived during that time when we depended upon what we could do to be happy or now we could make others happy.

Being a Christian has always been top priority with me. I am like the little boy who had a happy birthday, when his mother called for him to go to bed he said, "oh Momma-I am having such a good time that I don't want to go to bed--I'm afraid I'll miss something!"
